# WELCOME TO DESPERATE MEASURES!


This show is loosely inspired by William Shakespeare's Measure for Measure. Debuted in London in 1604, this play never neatly fit into the genre of comedy, tragedy, or history. Instead, Measure for Measure has long been considered a "problem play." The term originated in the 1860's, and refers to a script that explores conflicting points of view around contemporary social issues: the subordination of women; attitudes towards sex work; subjugation based on race, ethnicity, or nationality; and the tensions between law and justice, order and nature.

The award-winning 2017 musical *Desperate Measures*, on the other hand, is a comedy through and through. It features female characters with agency, smarts, creativity, bravery, and dimension... or as much of those things as you can get in a very silly musical. Set in this semi-fantastical "Wild West," in the territory of Arizona sometime around the 1890's, *Desperate Measures* tells the story of a cast of familiar and archetypal characters. There is a hot-headed, gun-slinging cowboy; a cunning sheriff chasing justice; a drunk Catholic priest who is questioning his faith; and a rigid governor determined to crack down on shoot-outs at the saloon. Not included are any archetypal or caricatured Native Americans – thank goodness. That said, *Desperate Measures* makes no mention at all of the Indigenous people that were an essential and historical part of the population on the land that would become the state of Arizona.

Sometimes, even well-intentioned attempts to challenge an audience to engage with conflicting points of views on social issues or painful histories of violence can objectify identities and reduce history, creating a limited, subjective conversation. And yet, erasing any mention of a community in settings in which it is historically present and remains present, does not feel like a solution either. Every play has its problems, and *Desperate Measures* is no different.

We hope this production delights and entertains you. #### **WRITER & LYRICIST + COMPOSER**

**Peter Kellogg**, (Writer and Lyricist) has two Tony nominations for book and lyrics to a musical of *Anna Karenina* (composer Dan Levine), which toured in Japan and was broadcast on Japanese Public TV in 2006. With David Friedman, he created *Desperate Measures* which won 2018 Drama Desk Awards for Best Music and Best Lyrics, as well as The Outer Critics Circle and off-Broadway Alliance Awards for Best Musical. David has written songs for everyone from Disney to Diana Ross, produced all the late/great Nancy LaMott's CD's and wrote many of her best known songs, conducted and vocal arranged 6 musicals on Broadway and numerous Disney Animated Films (Beauty & The Beast, Aladdin, Pocahontas, The Hunchback of Notre Dame) wrote songs for The Lizzie McGuire Movie, Aladdin and the King of Thieves, Bambi II and Trick, scored 3 television series, performed his revue Listen To My Heart - The Songs of David Friedman Off Broadway, all over America and abroad, and cowrote 100 songs (with Kathie Lee Gifford) for the Today Show's Everyone Has a Story Segment. David is a best-selling metaphysics author with 5 books including The Thought Exchange, and We Can Be Kind - Healing Our World One Kindness at a Time, based on his song of the same name. 
